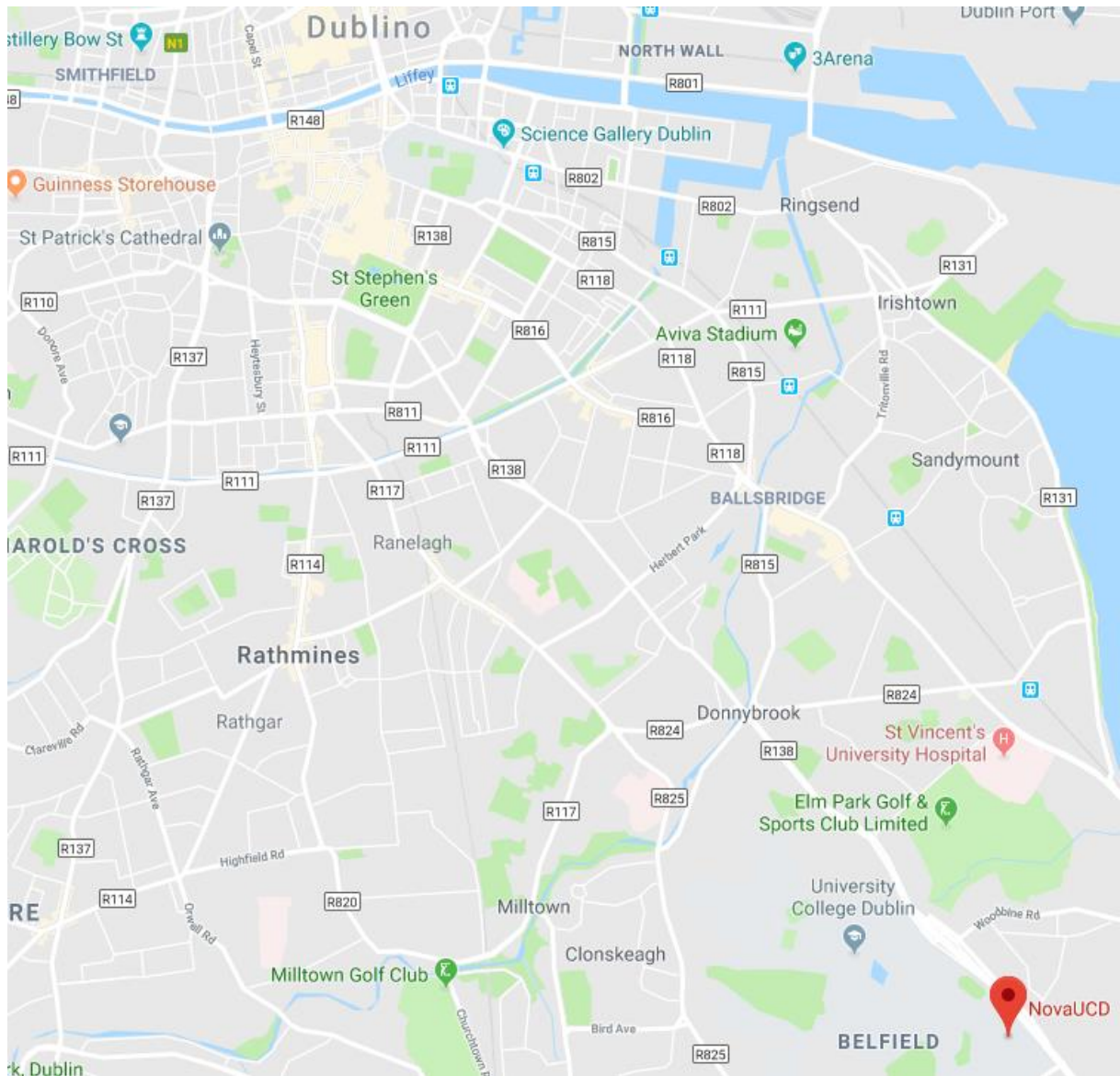

**How to get to/from the airport to Dublin city centre:**

**Airlink** is the express bus from the airport to the city center, the most used and the fastest. Stop at all points of interest such as Trinity College, Temple Bar, Christ Church and the Central Bus Station.

There are two solutions:

- the 747 bus that goes downtown and towards the north
- the 757 that leads to the center and to the south area Both take about 40 minutes to Temple Bar.

**Aircoach** is a private company very similar to Airlink and offers line 700, the only bus that connects Dublin airport and the center 24 hours a day. The bus runs approximately every 15/30 minutes based on to the

time slot and it takes about 30 minutes to reach the city center. The main stops are: Drumcondra, O'Connell Street, Trinity College / Grafton Street, Kildare Street, Leeson Street Lower, just to name a few.

**Dublin Bus.** The most economical solution is instead to choose between one of the various Dublin buses Buses serving the airport. Obviously they take more time than the Express line. In particular, No. 16 and No. 41 are the most practical: 1 hour to reach the center, with strategic stops at O'Connell Street and Parnell Square. Frequency: every 10 minutes from dawn to midnight. Other lines connecting the airport to the center: 748 for Houston Rail Station 746 for Dún Laoghaire 102 for Sutton Station.

Remember to bring some change because you only accept coins on city buses.
